


## Population Change from 1991 to 2016

Due to the release of the 2016 Census of Population from Statistics Canada, the Community Development Council Durham (CDCD) has been able to look at how population change in the last two decades has occurred in Durham Region. The population of Durham Region in 2016 was recorded at 645,862 individuals with a population density at 255.9 per square kilometre. Within the last two decades, the City of Oshawa saw the most growth in population count by 6% from 1991 to 2016. Meanwhile, the Township of Brock saw the least growth in population count, with a 2.6% increase from 1991 to 2016.

## Population Growth from 2011 to 2016

Between 2011 and 2016, Durham Region saw steady growth in all of its municipalities. Following the last two decades' trends, population in Durham Region continues to grow heavily in its urban and suburban areas. From 2011 to 2016, the Town of Ajax saw the most population growth with a 9.2% climb. This was closely followed by the Municipality of Clarington who saw a 8.8% growth. Low growth rates came from the Township of Scugog (0.2%), the Township of Brock (2.7%), and the Township of Uxbridge (2.7%).
